Brownie Fire Safety Badge

- 1. Find out how the fire service works and what happens when it receives an emergency call.
- 2. Know how most fires in the home start. Talk with the tester about some ways to prevent fires from starting.
- 3. Know about battery-operated and hard-wired smoke detectors. Describe:
 - the best places to put smoke detectors
 - the sound a smoke detector makes
 - how and when to test smoke detectors.
- 4. Make an escape plan for your home or meeting place. You should include:
 - two ways out of each room (if possible)
 - a meeting point outside, where everyone should go to.

Make sure everyone knows how to get out if there is a fire. Practice your escape plan at least once.

- 5. Describe each of the following:
 - How to call the fire service in an emergency.
 - How to escape from a smoke-filled room.
 - How to prevent smoke entering a room.
 - How to check for fire behind a door before opening it.
 - What you would do if your own (or someone else's) clothes caught fire.
- 6. Describe basic fire safety for:
 - ovens, hobs, grills, microwaves and toasters
 - fires and heaters
 - people who smoke.
