Droitwich YFA get Water Smart

YFA members used part of their summer camp to get 'Water Smart', to develop their water safety skills and pilot a new initiative from the Royal Life Saving Society UK (RLSS UK).

Sixteen members of the Young Firefighters Association (YFA) from Droitwich undertook the RLSS UK programme designed to give children and young people greater awareness of their own and other people's safety and risks in and around open water, whilst on summer camp on the River Wye.

The week-long camp in the Wye Valley also included hiking, kayaking, mountain-biking, bushcraft, and climbing, to encourage team building, communication, and learning to depend on each other.

The Water Smart training was completed recently indoors with the generous permission to use the swimming pool at Bromsgrove School.





Redditch Young Firefighter receives High Sheriff Award

At the annual HWFRS Worcestershire Medals and Awards Ceremony, Redditch Young Firefighter Shaun Grice (15) was presented with an award by the High Sheriff of Worcestershire, in recognition of his 'great and valuable services to the community'. The award is presented to the Young Firefighter who has shown the most improvement across a range of skills over the preceding 12 months, and who has demonstrated determination, enthusiasm and a desire to improve their personal skills and work within a team of young people.

Service Exercise Phoenix

Training Exercise Phoenix flew over Stourport in September, and 200 firefighters and other blue light personnel descended on an abandoned high school for a service-wide multi-agency training event. Young Firefighters from Droitwich added to the authenticity of a major incident by acting as clubbers and casualties in a smoke-filled building, awaiting rescue by the Fire Service, down ladders from first floor windows.

Young Firefighter Molly Fitzpatrick said: "The training exercise was brilliant because we got to be involved in a massive incident and to see how the Fire Service works with other organisations when a huge fire happens. We also got to shout a lot too!"



Wash and shine for charities

Young Firefighters from Redditch spent a day washing and shining cars and raised a fantastic total of £600. Half went to The Fire Fighters Charity and the rest was split between three of the charities supported by the Mayor of Redditch - including Bowel Cancer UK and the Sunnyside Centre in Redditch - and to the YFA, to help fund future projects.
