To identify the incident recordings, a search was conducted on property type, main cause, ignition source, false alarm type, and free text sections of the report.

For your request:

- The suggested BBQ incident category of
  - **Smoke only** was counted towards where no fire damage was recorded at the BBQ related incident, i.e. if there was a flame/fire it was limited to the BBQ.
  - Outdoor fire caused by BBQ use was counted towards for an unlimited amount of outdoor damage without affecting buildings.
  - **Fire resulting in structural or property damage linked to BBQ use** was counted towards if buildings were affected.
- Incidents linked to the use of disposable BBQs were counted towards when there was clear reference to the BBQ being a disposable BBQ in messages relayed to Fire Control in the incident log.
- Incidents where BBQs were used in inappropriate or unsafe locations we are unable to report on this part of your
  request as we can't quantify this consistently (i.e. what's inappropriate/unsafe vs appropriate/safe but unfortunately resulted
  in a fire incident).
