(4) Does your Fire and Rescue Service consider air fryers an emerging fire risk?	No, air fryers have not been identified as an emerging risk. They are an increasingly popular cooking appliance, but incident numbers and consequences have been relatively low.		
	The National Fire Chiefs Council (NFCC) suggest that air fryers are lower risk cooking appliances: Cooking with products with no flame and less or no direct heat will reduce the risk, so it's safer to cook using a microwave, air fryer or induction hob.		
(5) Should air fryers be given a category in the IRS checklist?	We would find this beneficial to more quickly identify whether the air fryer was the cause of the fire, but it is not something we directly control; the database is administered by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government.		
(6) What approximate amount of air fryer incidents you responded to were caused by faulty or dangerous appliances, and what amount as a result of user error? (i.e. more than	"Combustible articles too close to heat source (or fire)" is the most common main cause selection for the incidents identified as having a reference to an air fryer, with several incidents referring to an air fryer being situated on a hot cooker hob causing a fire or melting the appliance. Comparatively few incidents recorded a fault with the appliance itself.
